Principal Update – Kelly Aman

- The Magnet Recruitment season is here and the first Magnet Fair was on Saturday at Enloe. Our first Magnet Tour was today. They will be held twice a week through January. Our upcoming tours are already filled and closed, but we can consider adding more, if needed.
- Two Educator Grants were recently given: the first was for our Agriculture Dept which has 280 students enrolled. They used the grant to purchase potting soil for the raised beds. Chicks are coming back this week and our students have been working hard to assemble a shed. The second grant was for Ms. Heffelfinger to purchase a new infant simulator for our Family & Consumer Science Dept.

- The next Magnet Open House is scheduled for Tuesday, 11/15.

 - Ms. Viola, 1st Year Mathematics teacher:
 - Shared that our 6th graders are adapting very well.

- Wanted to remind that our 6th graders are eligible for clubs and extracurriculars, and encouraged to participate.
- Year 2: Joe Biggs and Laura Hudgins
 - Ms. Hudgins, 2nd Year Language Acquisition teacher:
 - Shared that our 7th graders are working hard and adjusting very well to the new school and grade level expectations. They are also behaving nicely in the halls and classes.
 - Students love the new spiritwear and their grade level shirts. On 11/7, we will celebrate the 7th day of the month by wearing grade level shirts or spiritwear.

- Reconciled bank accounts today balance in the Money Minder acct at First Citizens is \$45,405.33. The old PNC acct has under \$2k and will be moved over and closed when fully reconciled. On the recommendation of the outgoing Board, we changed banks from PNC to First Citizens due to PNC's fee structure changes.

VP of Communications/Volunteers – Morgan Blue

- Because our fundraising goals were so successful this year, we have been able to do more for our faculty and staff. For instance, we recently provided box lunches from Jason's Deli during the school-wide conference night on 10/13.
- Our Thanksgiving Pie Giveaway sign-up is ½ full already. The event will be held on 11/22 and we intend to send every member of staff home with a pie.

- School Improvement Plan (SIP) The second meeting took place last week on 10/17. There seems to be a point of confusion for how parents can use PowerSchool so they plan to hold a technology night for parents on that topic in the spring. In addition, with the district-wide transition from Google Classroom to Canvas for the 2023-24 school year, they plan to hold a technology night on that topic as well.

Holiday Hugs Program - this program includes 53 students who have been identified by our administration/counselors. It is scheduled for 12/15 and is staffed solely with teacher volunteers to respect the students' privacy. The students will stay after school, participate in crafts, attend a home basketball game, and then enjoy dinner. Administration will collect gift card donations from our school community so each student can go home with one grocery store gift card and one big box store gift card (Target, WalMart, Sam's Club, etc) for the holiday season. The PTA will be giving each student spirit wear as well.
